The Department of Creative Studies, in the Faculty of Creative and Critical Studies, at UBC Okanagan Campus invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track, research-stream position in pre-20th-century East Asian Art History within the Art History and Visual Culture program beginning July 1, 2022.

We seek a colleague who will contribute to our vision of creating and sharing innovative research with our students on the world's creative traditions and their intersections by teaching courses in pre-20th-century East Asian arts and visual cultures in global and transcultural contexts. Expertise with Indigenous perspectives from the region would be an asset. Applicants must have an active scholarly profile, a record of high-quality teaching, and a commitment to graduate supervision as well as service. They will be expected to contribute to the interdisciplinary nature of the Faculty of Creative and Critical Studies and the Interdisciplinary Graduate Studies program.

Applicants must have completed a Ph.D. or equivalent in East-Asian Art History or a closely related field by the start of the appointment. The successful candidate must have an active research profile, with research proficiency in East Asian language(s), strong inclusive teaching and communication skills (oral and written), interest in curriculum development, and potential for leadership. Knowledge and experience in curation and museum studies is highly desirable, as are interests in transcultural perspectives and digital humanities.

In accordance with UBC's equity plan, and pursuant to Section 42 of the BC Human Rights Code, the department is highly interested in equity-deserving candidates who will bring to their research and teaching the perspective that comes from the experiences of those underrepresented in higher education, particularly Indigenous, Black and racialized communities.

- curriculum vitae;
- research plan;

- examples of scholarly research;
- diversity statement;
- statement of teaching philosophy and interests;
- evidence of teaching effectiveness.
