Professorial Stream Cluster Hire in Physical Geography

The Faculty of Environmental and Urban Change (EUC) at York University invites highly qualified candidates to apply for one of **two** (2) professorial stream tenure-track appointments in **Physical Geography** at the rank of either Assistant or Associate Professor, to commence July 1, 2022. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. All York University positions are subject to budgetary approval.

One of these two opportunities is open only to qualified individuals who specifically self-identify as Black peoples of African descent (e.g., Africans and African heritage people from the Caribbean, Americas, or Europe). Recognizing the underrepresentation of Black faculty, this opportunity supports the University's Affirmative Action program and has been developed based on the special program provisions of the Ontario Human Rights Code. The successful candidate will be joining a vibrant scholarly community at York University, where we aspire to achieve equity and diversity in all areas, including race.

A PhD in physical geography or a related field (or a PhD near completion that must be completed by the start of the appointment) is required, with a demonstrated record of excellence or promise of excellence in scholarly research and in teaching. Applicants should have a clearly articulated program of research that aligns with the EUC and York University's strong institutional and collegial commitments to sustainability and climate action. We aspire to intensify and deepen teaching and research capacity in climate change science through biophysical scientific study of environmental change by hiring in two of the following three areas:

(i) **geomorphology** (ii) **climatology**, or (iii) **biogeography**. We seek candidates whose research contributes to the broader understanding of processes, mechanisms, energy budgets, impacts, or contributors to climate change.

The successful applicants will be expected to engage in innovative externally funded research at the highest level. Candidates must provide evidence of research excellence, or promise of research excellence, of a recognized international caliber as demonstrated in the research statement; a record of publications (or forthcoming publications) within significant journals in the field; presentations at major conferences; awards and accolades; and strong recommendations from referees of high standing.

The successful candidates will contribute to undergraduate teaching within EUC, emphasizing a science-based curriculum, focusing on the Environmental Science and Global Geography programs among others. We expect candidates to be suitable for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies and to contribute to graduate teaching and supervision. Evidence of excellence or promise of excellence in teaching will be provided through the teaching statement; teaching accomplishments and pedagogical innovations including in high priority areas such as experiential education and technology enhanced learning; teaching evaluations; and strong letters of reference.

The Faculty of Environmental and Urban Change at York University explicitly addresses the distinct, yet interconnected, challenges of environmental change and urbanization, with a focus on innovating diverse transitions to a sustainable and just future. EUC champions interdisciplinarity through curricular programs and scholarship; emphasizes field-based and experiential learning to enhance understanding of biophysical processes and social potentials; embraces global perspectives so that this understanding is derived from a broad range of places; and pursues community-engaged endeavours to generate meaningful scholarship and to train active citizens, innovators and leaders. As a community, we believe that making positive change requires bold and diverse thinking, ambitious action, and community engagement. We are inclusive and devoted to making the world a better place for all. EUC is currently home to five undergraduate programs leading to BES, BA, and BSc degree, Master's programs in Environmental Studies (MES and MES/JD), Geography (MA and MSc), Planning (MES); doctoral programs in Geography and Environmental Studies (PhD); as well as several undergraduate certificates and graduate diplomas. We invite suitable candidates to submit the following:

- a cover letter outlining their qualifications for the position as described above and indicating which rank is being applied for;
- a curriculum vitae;
- a statement of self-identification
- a statement of research interests (maximum of two pages);
- sample of publications (a maximum of two);
- a statement describing their teaching philosophy, a list of possible courses in our curriculum that they could teach, and additional teaching interests (maximum of two pages);
- contact information for three referees with knowledge of their work and/or recognized expertise (at least two of the references must be academic). Letters of reference will be solicited by the Search Committee for long-listed candidates and should **not** be sent with the initial application.
